

# Moceri's three hits power Spartans to victory

**HAMILTON** — Marc Moceri collected three of the Steinert High baseball team's seven hits in a 3-1 win over Cherokee yesterday.

Moceri, along with designated hitter Rob Pontani and second baseman Ryan Brydzinski, drove in a run apiece to lead the Spartans offense.

Pontani's RBI double was Steinert's only extra-base hit.

Kyle Paul remained perfect on the season, improving to 4-0 by allowing one run and five hits over 5 2/3 innings.

Neil Harm pitched the final 1 1/3 innings to earn his first save. He allowed one hit and struck out one as Steinert improved to 14-1.
